Day 1: Monday, 20 April – Welcome to Salamanca

- Flight to Salamanca (exact time and location will be provided closer to the date)
- Arrive and settle into our hotel
- Free time to explore the city at your own pace and relax

Day 2: Tuesday, 21 April – Exploring Salamanca, the Heart of Castile and León

- Spanish Language Lesson #1 in the hotel lobby, followed by a language challenge
- Café Novelty, a literary café frequented by writers, and Salamanca's oldest café
- **Guided walking tour**, including the Old City of Salamanca, a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, Plaza Mayor (watch the sunset light the golden stone!), the New and Old Cathedral, the University facade (look for the frog!), and *Casa de las Conchas*
- Tapas dinner near Calle Van Dyck, one of Spain's best streets for eating tapas
- Early evening **flamenco show or live guitar** at *La Malhablada* or *Centro de Flamenco Salamanca* (TBC)

Day 3: Wednesday, 22 April – Salamanca's Intellectual and Artistic Soul

- Spanish Language Lesson #2 in the hotel lobby, followed by a language challenge
- Visit of the University of Salamanca, Spain's oldest University
- Scala Coeli, another World Heritage Site climb the Clerecía tower for a panomaric view over Salamanca
- Free time to visit the Museum of Art Nouveau and Art Deco (optional), stroll along The Tormes River, or relax at a shaded café
- Wine tasting experience at a wine bar like Vinodiario
- Optional: Cultural concert at the Palacio de Congresos (TBC)

Day 4: Thursday, 23 April – Day Trip to Segovia, Between Roman and Gothic Elegance

- Depart by private transport or train to Segovia (about 1.5-2 hours)
- Spanish Language Lesson #3: shorter revision session in a park or at a café, followed by a language challenge
- Visit of the Roman aqueduct, Segovia Cathedral, and Alcázar (castle that inspired Disney)
- Free time to explore the Jewish quarter, or stroll along the Eresma River
- Return to Salamanca if dates align, attend a local literary or music event

Day 5: Friday, 24 April – Food & Poetry of Salamanca

- Spanish Language Lesson #4 in the hotel lobby, followed by a language challenge
- Stop at a **bookstore or cultural space** like *Librería Víctor Jara* for books by Spanish poets and writers
- Free time to relax and shop for local crafts (ham, embroidery, fans)
- Cooking class with a local chef: prepare *hornazo* (stuffed meat pie), *tapas*, or local fish dishes
- Farewell dinner at a local restaurant with live traditional music

Day 6: Saturday, 25 April – Free time in Salamanca & Farewell

- Spanish Language Lesson #5 in the hotel lobby, followed by a language challenge
- Free time before your return flight
